Smallholder Working Group (Next Meeting: September 15, 2026)

- Refining how we describe and reach smallholders nationally, focusing on shared parameters rather than a formal definition. This will support clearer communication with hobby farmers and other audiences who may not identify as “farmers” or “smallholders.”
- Emerging disease risks remain a key focus for smallholder audiences, including HPAI, New World Screwworm, salmonella in small poultry flocks, FMD, capripox, and Newcastle disease.
- Members also discussed practical outreach needs, including pet owner and rescue organization messaging, small flock poultry and swine surveillance, and potential “biosecurity in a box” resources for 4-H groups and local fairs.

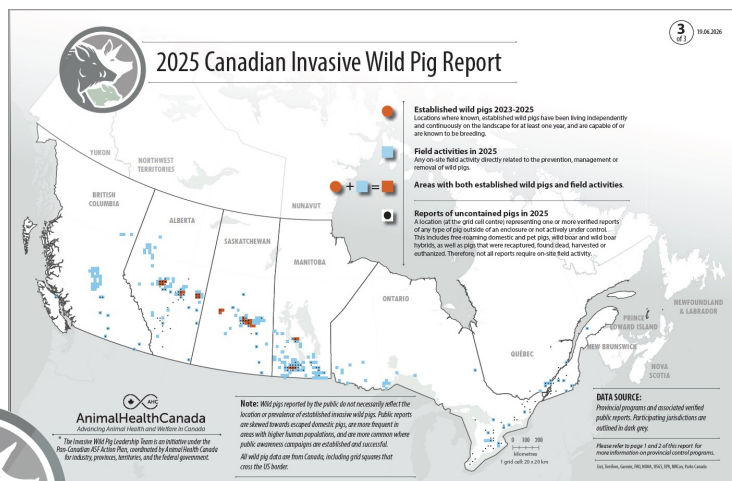
New World Screwworm Infographics and Resources
