What does CEZD do?



CEZD conducts environmental scanning for emerging and zoonotic diseases and produces weekly intelligence reports based upon signal ratings by members.



When specific signals are of concern, CEZD facilitates further evaluation and analysis as needed. The community also engages in monthly calls and webinars to share items of interest.




The collective intelligence generated through these processes is shared with the community members to provide early warning for emerging animal diseases and zoonotic diseases.

Who are the Community Members?

Members are professionals in animal, public, or environmental health with an interest in emerging and zoonotic diseases.

They work in academia, private, and public sectors, (Municipal/Provincial/Federal), animal industries and various animal health networks across Canada.



Many CEZD members are also members of the Canadian Animal Health Surveillance System (CAHSS).



Community Collaboration and Activities



Community members contribute their expertise through various mechanisms, depending on their interest and expertise.



Members can be passive or active. Passive members receive intelligence reports. Active members engage in activities and receive all of the CEZD communications materials.



Professionals are eligible to access the Canadian Network for Public Health Intelligence (CNPHI) and rate signals for the community.



Environmental Scanning - The process of systematically scanning defined sources of information to build

and maintain situational awareness, including the identification and classification of potential signals, and the documention of the results. Intelligence - Information that is compiled, summarized, analyzed/assessed, processed and disseminated

to the community in order to contribute to more informed decision-making

Signal - information that suggests the potential for occurrence of a risk.
