1. CEZD ASF Weekly Intelligence Report: December 28, 2018 – January 17, 2019

Summary of Global Information
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mongolia has reported being affected by ASF.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Disease continues to spread in Europe and China<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Europe – the pattern of spread within Europe remains the same. Wild boar 'outbreaks' are usually only an individual animal or a small group.○ China – The disease continued to spread in domestic swine and was reported in a new (24th) province.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• China <u>reported</u> an outbreak occurred on a large farm with approximately 73,000 pigs in Mingshui County, Suihua City.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Dead pigs were found in Kinmen County, Taiwan and one <u>tested positive</u> for ASF. The gene sequence was 100% matching with the ASF virus in China.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Chinese New Year is expected to bring an increase in the <u>consumption of pork</u> as well as an increase in Chinese set to travel abroad over the lunar new year.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The country of Mongolia is <u>reporting</u> its first outbreak of ASF in four provinces.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• ASF <u>has moved</u> to just over one kilometre from the Belgian-French border and French authorities are considering additional measures, e.g. wild boar cull and building an additional fence.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Australia's Department of Agriculture and Water Resources <u>reports</u> that they tested samples of pork products seized at international airports and mail processing centres and six pork products from 152 tested were contaminated with ASF virus.
