**Disease:** Novel Coronavirus (nCoV)  
**Species affected:** Human

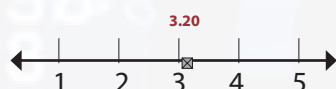
**Description:** The situation has now morphed into a growing epidemic across China with over 4400 of confirmed cases and 107 deaths in mainland China. More than 45 cases have been confirmed in other places with nearly all of them involving people who visited Wuhan recently. The government has sealed off Wuhan and other cities in Hubei province in a bid to contain the virus. Canada has confirmed a case in Toronto of a man in his 50s who travelled to Wuhan, China. The origin of the outbreak has yet to be confirmed but animals are suspected to be the source.

**Disease:** African Swine Fever (ASF)  
**Species affected:** Porcine  
**Location:** Europe  
**Community Relevance Rating:** 3.20

**Description:** ASF has moved up in Poland to 12km from the border with Germany, the closest the virus has been found so far, showing that the virus is gradually creeping west. In the meantime, Germany and Poland are discussing new actions to prevent the spread of ASF, including border fences and increased hunting of the animals. The German ministry also wrote that the 'swine fever regulation' has been extended. This enables authorities in federal states to erect flexible fences or wildlife barriers in the event of an outbreak. This allows migration of wild boar to be restricted.

**Description:** The Bureau of Customs – Manila International Container Port (MICP) has seized a container of food after it tested positive for ASF in order to prevent further spread of the disease. The content of the shipment was immediately disposed of in accordance with the recommendation of the Veterinary Quarantine Services (VQS). It was noted that the seized products were not covered by any permit from the Bureau of Animal Industry.
